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World's first COVID-19 vaccine alternating dose study launches in Liverpool

The National Institute for Health Research supported study, which will be run by a partnership between Liverpool School of Tropical Medicine, the National Institute for Health Research Clinical Research Network: North West Coast and Liverpool University Hospitals NHS Foundation Trust will determine the effects of using a different vaccine for the second dose to the first dose, in addition to two different intervals between doses.


